God loves Multiplication

I was a good student in school. I did well in my classes but the class I found most challenging was math. My father was great at math and as an engineer, he would be able to do math problems easily in his head. Often, as he was helping me with my math homework, he would remind me that math is a form of logic. "It is a way of thinking to solve problems and find solutions" he would tell me.



While we don't usually think of God and math together, God loves multiplication. God's logic, God way of solving problems and finding solutions is through amazing math that multiplies the people involved, and the impact. For example, 5 loaves and 2 fish when put together with Jesus and prayer, feed over 5,000 people! Or one woman at the well, who meets Jesus, changes the hearts and minds of her entire village. God's math is about multiplying the impact and the number of people so that amazing things happen. Miracles happen with God's math and God's multiplication.

In October, we will begin our new worship series on multiplication as we continue to prepare for the new people God is sending to our congregation. As we continue to learn about God's multiplication, let us also multiply our efforts to impact our community, nation and world through the amazing ministries of God's church.

2019 Operating Budget FundraiserQUESTIONS & ANSWERS

In response to the mid-June letter requesting Fundraiser contributions for the Operating Budget, through September 23, 2019 we have received \$13,145. Our goal by December 31 is to raise at least \$55,000. Various questions have been asked related to this Fundraiser, and here are the answers.

Don't offering plate contributions fully fund the operating budget?

Not any longer. This is a trend Nardin Park and most other churches are experiencing. For example, during the past two and one-half years, a number of long-time Nardin Park members who were substantial donors have passed away. Thus, annual contributions are reduced more than \$52,000.

We received a large bequest; why don't we use \$55,000 of that?

A comprehensive funding plan for use of the Elaine Haskell Bequest was adopted by church council that is designed both to improve and maintain Nardin Park's facility, as well as support growth by enhancing current and future programs. That plan set aside nearly 40% of the bequest to fund annual operating budgets. \$50,000 of this amount was allocated directly to the 2019 operating budget. The balance is invested to generate income for use annually in future Operating Budgets.

Why did we donate \$50,000 to Cass United Methodist Church?

During planning for how to use the Haskell Bequest, the church council, finance and trustees unanimously agreed, in the spirit of Christian charity, it would be appropriate to share some part of this gift outside of Nardin Park.

When the need at Cass arose, the authorized committees decided that such a contribution, which was only 1.67% of the total Bequest received, was appropriate.

Why are we spending money on remodeling the building?

In order to grow our church, we need to update our 55 year old facility. Church Council, Finance and Trustees have allocated up to \$1.3 million out of the bequest to update our facilities.

Why did we create 3 new part time program staff positions?

Recent part time hires were made to better position Nardin Park for growth. One staff position is being paid, this year, entirely from a grant we received from a source outside of Nardin Park and the 2 other positions are being paid from funds from the Haskell Bequest. These costs are not being paid from the operating budget.

- Phase I of the construction (New restrooms, offices and children's classroom) is scheduled to be completed this week!
- Phase II of the construction (Sanctuary) started last week and we hope to be back in the sanctuary in early December!

What is coming up:

- Carolyn Bough is the new coordinator of the Governance Team. This team will be bringing a new streamlined church governance structure to church council, then nominations will begin its work to nominate leaders for the new structure. New leaders will begin serving June 1st, 2020.
- New worship service is on target to launch on Sunday morning March 1st, 2020. It will be at 9 a.m. and will be band led and less formal than our current service. On March 1st, 2020, our current worship service will move from 10 a.m. to 11 a.m. and it will be choir led and much as it is now in format and formality.
