

BLUE At HOME with GOD ALL HANDS ON DECK OCTOBER 2019

This Month: We build Community Foundations.

This month we will be hearing stories about Moses and the Israelites. Moses is called by God to deliver the Israelites out of slavery and onto the promised land. Moses confronts Pharaoh and the people are set free! God's might act of parting the Reed Sea allows the Israelites a safe passage out of Egypt into the desert. Then God provides the people with food and water each day as they wander through

the desert towards the promised land. To help the people live well together, God then provides the Ten Commandments. The first three help the people have a good relationship with God and the remaining seven help the people have good relationships with each other. These stories are foundational to our faith community.

If Seniors Had Regular Visitors, There'd be Fewer "Grumpy Old Men."



In my role as Pastor of Congregational Care at Nardin Park, it is my privilege to visit members in a variety of nursing care settings. I give thanks for the dedicated Congregational Care team of this church, who work tirelessly to provide prayer, support, and encouragement to our members who find themselves cut off from their church home due to health and life situations. I am aware of the value and importance of this ministry of presence. And while I have witnessed the compassionate and caring presence of rehab and nursing care staff, I am also aware they are greatly overworked, underpaid, and underappreciated. I have heard the horror stories about "some places" and witnessed others. I am keenly aware that those who are regularly visited receive somewhat better care than those who are not.

According to the latest national data (2015), there are 1.3 million people living in long term care facilities. In Michigan there are 434 nursing homes with 46,356 beds. We are currently at 87% capacity. On any given day, it is estimated that at least half of these residents receive no regular visitation.

One is reminded of the Parable of the Good Samaritan as we leave unattended the needs of our neighbors to walk to the bedside of a fellow parishioner. So what then are we to do? Last month I attended a workshop on ways to establish a one-on-one visitation ministry with our neighbors in our nearby nursing homes and care facilities. This would be a ministry of presence and caring beyond our membership, to strangers, yes strangers who rarely receive visitors.

Would you be interested in being a part of the creation of such a ministry here at Nardin Park. Let's reach out with the love of Christ to those left unattended and alone. Please contact Carolyn Bough (robertbough@gmail.com) or me (GCovintree@nardinpark.org) this month. There are folks out there, neighbors, waiting, who'd really enjoy a visit.

Let's get the ball rolling! Let's make it so!




FRIDAY NIGHT LIVE CONCERTS
