# Straw Poll Vote



# Straw Poll Vote on New Welcoming Statement and joining Reconciling Ministries passes by 83%

On Sunday, Nov. 17th, a non binding straw poll vote was taken on Nardin Park's new welcome statement and whether or not Nardin Park should become a reconciling congregation. The non binding poll results were the following: 149 votes were cast. 120 of those votes were yes, 25 of those votes were no and 4 were to abstain. Votes to abstain do not count in the percentage totals therefore the percentage totals are calculated from 145 votes and the percentage results are that (rounded up to nearest whole number) 83% said yes, 17% said no.

Since this was a non binding straw poll vote, to help the reconciling ministries team understand where the church stands at this particular moment on this particular matter. The next step will be for the reconciling ministries team to meet and determine when the official vote will be held. It will be sometime after the first of the year. Here is the welcome statement that was voted on.

Nardin Park UMC celebrates that everyone is created in God's image and is of sacred worth. We welcome all into full participation in our church without regard to age, race, culture, sexual orientation, gender identity/expression, family configuration, religious background, socio-economic situation, citizenship, language and/or ability.


