Happy New Year! Happy New You!

Happy New Year Nardin Park! It is a brand new year and that brings a freshness of the spirit. I don't know about you, but I am still getting used to typing 2020 on my documents! It always takes a while to adjust to the new thing, but pretty soon it will seem normal to write those numbers on all things.

Over the holidays, I started a 1,000 piece jigsaw puzzle! It is a nature scene, with lots of flowers and trees. And while I have made significant progresst on it, I am still struggling to figure out which pieces goes with the sky and the water and all the flowers. While working on the puzzle, I was thinking about how when we look at one small piece of things, it is not always apparent where it fits in the whole puzzle. And I found that sometimes, I put a piece in the sky, only to discover that it was really the water instead! (And thus it goes on the bottom of the puzzle, not the top). Life is like that sometimes as well. When we see only a piece of things, it is difficult to figure out where it fits and how it fits and sometimes what we think is the sky, turns out to the be the water. But when we keep working the puzzle, with patience, perseverance, trust and faith, we find that the pieces do eventually all fit and we have those wonderful "aha" moments where we discover a new perspective, and that what we thought was the sky is really the water! Faith is like that as well, it requires us to keep working the pieces, to trust in God for the big picture and for the fact that the pieces will all, eventually fit. During this season of Epiphany, we also look for the ways that God surprises us, showing up when we don't expect it and offering blessings and grace in unexpected places—like the puzzle, God often surprises us with how the pieces all fit.

It is going to be an exciting new year at Nardin Park with our new worship service launching at 9 a.m. on March 1st and our 10 a.m. service moving to 11 a.m. on that date as well. In addition, we are moving ahead with continued updates to our building to make it more welcoming, changes in our governance structure to streamline our decision making process and have people spend less time in meetings and more time in ministry, and we will be introducing a spiritual gifts inventory process to help everyone discover and use their particular spiritual gifts for the sake of Christ.

WELCOME STATEMENT VOTE! Coming up on January 26th



In November, the Reconciling Ministry Team conducted a straw poll to find out how the congregation felt about their proposed welcoming statement. Should this become the welcome statement for our church? By an overwhelming 83%, we voiced our support of the Reconciling Ministry Team's efforts.

Now comes the next step. The official vote. On Sunday, January 26, 2020, following our 10 am. morning worship service, we will have an official vote on the Welcome Statement (written out below). We will follow the same procedure we followed in November when we took the straw poll. Ballots will be handed out after the morning worship service. You must be a member or affiliate member of Nardin Park United Methodist Church and be present to vote. The ballot will contain three choices: "Yes," in favor of the statement and becoming part of the Reconciling Ministries Network; "No," not in favor; and "Abstain." (Please note, as with the straw poll, abstentions will be noted but not be counted as part of the total vote count).

The vote will be counted and our decision announced that Sunday.

If this welcoming statement is approved it will be the official Welcome Statement of our church. It will be used on all our operational, mission, and outreach materials. With the adoption of this statement we will seek to become a part of the Reconciling Ministries Network of United Methodist Churches worldwide (rmnnetwork.org).

Nardin Park UMC celebrates that everyone is created in God's image and is of sacred worth. We welcome all into full participation in our church without regard to age, race, culture, sexual orientation, gender identity/expression, family configurations, religious background, socio-economic situation, citizenship, language, and/or ability.

You may have seen the headline this past week about a plan for a split in the United Methodist Church. This is one of many proposals. It still has to be turned into legislation for General Conference 2020, which will be held in Minneapolis, MN. It remains to be seen what, if any, will actually pass once the delegates set down to work in early May. The point being, nothing has been decided yet. 
Super Bowl Party - Sunday, February 2 at 6:00pm.


